Superintendent's Report

- There are 523 students registered in our Pre-K through Grade 8 programs as of today. We are still below the capacity of this building should a large number of students ever register in the near future.
- As of today, we have 29 students enrolled in the Pre-Kindergarten program. These numbers are not inclusive
 of the pre-school disabled students. As of this point, Pre-Kindergarten has reached its maximum capacity.
 We do have a waiting list that parents can have the opportunity to send their children should any current
 students drop out of the program. There are 53 students registered for Kindergarten.
- We just concluded Hispanic Heritage Month here at CPS! The students are learning many things in their classrooms and we have displays around the school. Our students loved the assembly with the Las Alegrias Flamenco dancers! They even had a chance to get up and dance!
- During the week of October 3rd, Carlstadt Public School celebrated the annual Week of Respect. This week is but one of the many weeks throughout the year we foster and promote an environment of respect for all students, in order to create a positive school climate for growth and learning. School-wide activities included:
 - "Appreciation Station" during lunch periods
 - Classroom lessons focused on inclusion and respect
 - Daily morning announcements
 - Respect themed spirit week
- This week, we are officially launching our school-wide incentive program, Cougars Care! This program will focus on celebrating students who show respect, empathy,

- The district is wrapping up its annual audit this week, and while the final reports have not yet been issued, it is clear that we continue to maintain a healthy financial position. There will once again be some delays in the final reports being issued due to data from the State of NJ being unavailable at this time. We expect that one again that Audit deadline in December will be pushed into the New Year.
- Construction for the district continues to move forward. Though supply chain delays caused by COVID-19 have greatly affected our timelines, we are making steady progress. The Boiler Replacement project is nearly complete and the new boilers are up and running, and the Sitework and STEAM Lab projects are starting to gain traction.
- We are extremely pleased to announce that Carlstadt Public School has received the "Best in NJ Farm to School Award" for our food service program. New Jersey schools that entered the Farm to School Recognition Program for the current school year were required to show evidence of working with farmers and the community to ensure students have access to healthy Jersey Fresh fruits and vegetables in their school cafeterias and classrooms. A big thank you to Pomptonian for all of their hard work in creating such a strong food service program for our district.
- Finally, I am pleased to announce that we have received \$25,093 more in Extraordinary Aid than was originally budgeted and received additional aid this year for Maintenance of Equity (a newly created State Aid category) in the amount of \$189,378.
